${ }^{\wedge \wedge}$ After the 2010 Parliamentary election the Government announced changes to legislation and brought in fixed terms for Parliamentary elections although the Government can call an election at any time. 1^^ In 2022 new legislation was brought in to repeal the Fixed Term Parliaments Act 2011 and this now allows the Prime Minister to call a general election at a time of their choosing.
